HISTORY AND PRESENT CONDITION.

THE UNIVERSITY OF NASHVILLE was incorporated by the General Assembly of North Carolina, December 20, 1785, under the name and title of Davidson Academy; and by the Legislature of Tennessee, September 11, 1806, as Cumberland College. On the 26th of November, 1826, by the act of the Legislature, it acquired its present legal style. For nearly *three-fourths* of a century it has faithfully served the great cause of education and among its many graduates are numbered some of the most eminent men of the South.

THE MEDICAL DEPARTMENT was organized in 1850, and is now SECOND in the United States in point of patronage.

In the COLLEGIATE DEPARTMENT the *Military System* was adopted in 1855, by a union with the officers of the Western Military Institute. The honors conferred by this Institute have been confirmed by the Board of Trustees of the University, and the graduates of the former have thus become Alumni of the latter.

For a period of four years the Military system has been thoroughly tested in this University; and as a means of promoting good order, regular, industrious habits, economy and healthy exercise, it has entirely fulfilled the expectation of its numerous friends and proved an effectual aid in moral, mental and physical culture. The citizens of Nashville will bear unqualified testimony to the quiet and orderly deportment and to the regular and unobtrusive habits of the students under the salutary rules imposed by Military authority.

During the last session there were in the two Departments 600 students in attendance, and the prospects of large accessions in both departments appear to be more encouraging now than at any former period.

COURSE OF INSTRUCTION.

The studies of the Preparatory Class are as follows: Geography, illustrated by Globes and Outline Maps, English Grammar, Arithmetic, Algebra, through Quadratic Equations, Weld's Latin Lessons, Bullions' Latin Grammar and Reader, Cæsar, Sallust, Greek Grammar and Reader, Composition and Declamation.

Students of the Scientific Course may substitute the Latin and Greek included in the Preparatory, Freshman and Sophomore years of the Classical Course for Modern Languages, or they may substitute Spanish for either the French or German Language.

Pupils, whose parents do not desire the full course for them, may be admitted to a partial or selected course, but a study once taken up, cannot, without the written request of the parent or guardian, be discontinued until completed. It is a common and serious error to suffer boys to select their own course of study.

The College will be carefully preserved from the control or domination of any party or sect in religion or politics.

Every Cadet will be required to attend Divine Service on the Sabbath.

It is required that every student shall remain till the close of the current term. Cadets can be seen by friends at the College buildings, but cannot be taken away, except by parents, during the session; nor can a student be granted a leave of absence to visit the city, or for any other purpose, more than five times during a term of twenty weeks. Such leaves will, as far as practicable be limited to Saturdays, afternoon, and will not extend into the night.

ADMISSION AND GRADUATION.

Boys over fourteen years of age, who are prepared to enter upon the prescribed course of studies, will be received as Cadets upon application to the Superintendent, the presentation of proper testimonials of moral character, and the usual pledge of obedience to the laws of the University, and to the orders of Professors.

Students, on their arrival, should proceed to the Cadets' Barracks without stopping in the city, report immediately to the Superintendent, and enter at once upon their duties.

No student will be permitted to room or board out of the College buildings, except upon such arrangements with the Chancellor and Faculty, as will secure strict discipline and perfect regularity in attendance on College duties.

The degree of BACHELOR OF ARTS will be granted only to those who have passed a satisfactory examination in the studies of the Classical Course; that of BACHELOR OF SCIENCE to those who have passed a similar examination in the Scientific Course; and certificates may, at the discretion of the Faculty, be issued to approved Cadets who have taken a select course. The MASTER'S DEGREE is conferred (in course) three years after the Bachelor's.

MILITARY ORGANIZATION.

It should be especially borne in mind, that the object of the organization is to aid in governing and controlling the students, and to promote their health, physical development, and mental vigor; and that so far from wasting their time in the study of Military Science and branches not applicable to the ordinary peaceful pursuits of life, the Military system is the very means by which their time may be economized and their energies and industry more strictly applied so as to attain more than ordinary success in classical and scientific studies.

By the aid of the uniform dress, this organization secures, among other *personal advantages*, those of economy, neatness, equality, and a just appreciation of others upon merit only. Compared with the military drill, no system of *physical* training ever devised, is better adapted to the student. It takes him from his books, over which he has been bending for hours, brings him to an erect position, gives him a firm, graceful, manly carriage, expands his chest, puts into harmonious action every limb and muscle, and thus promotes a perfect physical development, and a consequent increase of mental vigor.

As a means of *moral training*, military discipline is *invaluable*. It promotes two great moral principles—*subordination* and *method*—the elements that secure deference to authority, fidelity to law, the performance of obligations, the observance of every duty and adherence to all the great principles of society; and with a due regard to religious motives, no stronger, more durable, or more appropriate foundation can be laid for the virtues of the good citizen and the upright man.

All these are designed to be *gained* by superadding to the Course *military instruction at hours usually misspent by the voluntary system.*

There are daily military exercises on the field, when the weather permits, but without prejudice to study—a time in the afternoon being appropriated to it, otherwise apt to be squandered.

In matters of indulgences and discipline, the Cadet must be wholly governed by the authorities of the College.

ACADEMIC YEAR.

The next session of this College will open on Monday, the 5th of September, 1859. The second term of the session commences on the 23d of January 1860. The next Annual Commencement takes place on the 7th of June, 1860.

TERMS.

For tuition, boarding, washing, fuel, unfurnished rooms, servants' attendance, and use of arms, \$105 per term. Surgeon's fee and medicine, \$5 per term.

The necessary articles of furniture for rooms, of a cheap and uniform style, may be purchased on College grounds.

Students boarding out of College are charged for tuition, fuel, use of public rooms and arms, \$37 50 per term of 20 weeks.

Payment **MUST BE MADE IN ADVANCE.** Cadets are required to deposit with a College Guardian, or with the Superintendent, all the funds in their possession, including an amount sufficient to meet current expenses.

Damages done to the College property will be assessed monthly, and each student required to pay an equal proportion of the assessment.

Students are received at any time during the session, but no deduction of any kind will be made during the first month; nor will any deduction of tuition or surgeon's fee be made for less than half a term. A student leaving the Institute during the session, for any cause, will be refunded the balance on deposit, after deducting \$5 per week for board during the time he may have

been in attendance; but tuition and surgeon's fee will not be refunded. If extra branches are taken up and dropped before the end of the term, no deduction from the extra charge will be made.

To carry out the military system, to maintain a complete supervision and control of the expenses as well as the conduct of students, and to avoid the excesses so liable to occur when numerous shops and stores, offering unlimited credit, are open to them, books, clothing, and every thing necessary to supply their wants, are furnished at the College buildings, at Nashville prices; and the credit system, alike ruinous to the habits and wasteful to the resources of students, is prohibited.

As the privilege to go out from the College grounds to make purchases, etc., would subvert the whole system of discipline and control, it will be strictly withheld. Every Cadet is required to keep a correct account of his expenses, which must be exhibited to the Superintendent when required.

All money for the use of Cadets, must be remitted directly to the Treasurer, Superintendent or College Guardian, with statement as to the amount of pocket money which (if any) shall be allowed per month.

Students are required to keep their expenditures within moderate limits; extravagance in this respect being sufficient cause for dismissal from the College.

Medical Department of the University of Nashville.

THE Trustees and Medical Faculty of the University of Nashville take great pleasure in announcing to its friends and alumni its continued prosperity. Its eighth and last session closed with the largest class ever assembled within its halls, being, indeed, the largest by far ever attracted by any Medical College in the South or West.

Profoundly impressed with the great kindness and patronage of their brethren throughout the slaveholding States, and the general good will of the entire profession of the United States, the Faculty are stimulated to renewed exertions to make the institution, in all of its appointments, deserving of this warm and persisting support.

ANNOUNCEMENT OF THE SESSION OF 1859-60.

MEDICINE is taught in this Institution NINE months annually. There will be two sessions, but only one public commencement, as they count for one Course. A Summer Session, commencing the first Monday of each April, continues four months, and is especially devoted to Clinical Instruction, Practical Demonstration, and daily Examinations. The regular Winter Session opens the first Monday of each November, and Commencement is held early in March following. Students may, however, be examined for the degree in July.

A Preliminary Course of Lectures, free to all Students, will be given by the Professors, commencing on the first Monday of October, and at the same time the Anatomical Rooms will be opened for Students, under the supervision of the Professor of Anatomy. The ticket for Practical Anatomy is obligatory one session.

The TENNESSEE STATE HOSPITAL, under the direction of the Faculty, is open to the class, free of charge; and a Clinique has been established in connection with the University, at which operations are performed, and cases prescribed for and lectured upon in the presence of the Class. The Hospital continues under the management of the Sisters of Charity, and is in every respect a First Class one.

The candidate for the degree of *Doctor of Medicine* must have attained the age of twenty-one years, and have been engaged in the study of Medicine three years. He must have attended two full Courses of Lectures in a regular and accredited School of Medicine, the last of which in this Institution. He must write an acceptable Thesis, and deposit it with the Dean on or before the first day of February, on some Medical subject of his own selection. He must, at the time of receiving the degree, acknowledge the right of the Faculty to revoke it, should he engage in irregular or unprofessional practices.

*The fees are the same, regardless of the time the student is in actual attendance upon the lectures. The opportunity is afforded him of attending nine months if he chooses, but if he prefer five, or four months, the fees are the same.

If he matriculate in April the sum of \$50 00 is required of him in advance, and when he enters again in November, upon the winter course, he must pay \$55 00 more, making in the aggregate the fee of \$105 00 for the course. If he matriculate in November he pays at once the entire fee of \$105 00. The American Medical Association has from the beginning of its existence up to the termination of its last session, insisted upon the necessity of longer college study for medical students, and this Institution has not only come up to the requirements of the Association, but even gone beyond them.
