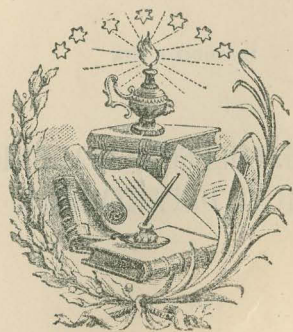

STATE NORMAL COLLEGE.

COURSE OF STUDY, ETC.

THE STATE NORMAL COLLEGE was opened with appropriate ceremonies on Wednesday, the 1st of December, 1875, and is designed for the professional education of Teachers, and "practice in all grades of instruction." It constitutes the Literary Department of the University of Nashville, but is under the sanction of the State of Tennessee. It derives its support at present from the funds of the University and the "Peabody Education Fund." It receives as students young gentlemen and ladies from Tennessee or any of the States, and is designed, by the three Boards interested in its welfare, to become a center of educational influence for this and all neighboring States.

ADMISSION.

Persons applying for admission must not be "under sixteen years of age, nor over thirty." Candidates must present a certificate of good moral character; must declare their intention to become teachers, and their willingness to observe faithfully the regulations and perform the duties required while members of the institution, and pass a satisfactory examination in the ordinary grammar-school studies, viz: Reading, Spelling, Writing, Grammar, Geography, Arithmetic, Elementary Geology and History of the United States. Applications should be made to the Chancellor of the University.

DESIGN.

The State Normal College is strictly professional, and does not, where it can possibly be avoided, propose to undertake any work which can be as well performed in the ordinary schools. The more thorough and complete the previous education of the student, the more valuable will be the advantages to be acquired at the College.

The institution designs to prepare its students, as far as possible, for the organizing, teaching, and general management of schools and higher educational institutions, both public and private. To effect this object the

COURSE OF INSTRUCTION

Requires that the student should possess a thorough knowledge—*first*, of the branches of learning required to be taught in the different grades of schools, and which should be, as far as possible, previously acquired; and, *second*, of the most economical and effective methods of teaching those branches. Consequently, the course of instruction embraces a rapid review of the more elementary studies with reference to the best ways of teaching them, a review of the higher branches of knowledge with the same object, and a careful study of such other branches as time and circumstances will permit. The scholastic year is divided into three terms.

STUDIES.

First Term.—Primary and grammar-school studies, with reference to teaching them, viz: Arithmetic, oral and written; Geography, physical and civil; Map-drawing, English Grammar and Analysis, etc.

Second Term.—Geometry, Chemistry with its applications to the purposes of common life; History of the United States, Physiology and Hygiene, Map-drawing, etc.

Third Term.—Geometry completed, Chemistry completed, Rhetoric, Book-keeping.

SECOND YEAR.

First Term.—Algebra, English Literature, Natural History, Natural Philosophy.

Second Term.—Trigonometry, Psychology, Geology, English Literature.

Third Term.—General History, Trigonometry, Botany, Psychology.

THIRD YEAR.

First Term.—Calculus, Astronomy, Constitution of the United States, School Laws of Tennessee, Moral Science, Practice and Observation in the City Schools.

Second Term.—Calculus, Astronomy, Reviews in Grammar and High School Studies.

Third Term.—Physics and Natural History with reference to Object Teaching, Theory and Art of Teaching, Practice and Observation in City Schools, Languages, etc., reviewed and completed.

A fourth year of study has recently been added to the course for the benefit of such as wish to pursue studies in advance of the undergraduate course.

Such changes will be made in the course, from time to time, and such studies added, as circumstances may require.

The Latin, French and German languages, are taken according to a parallel course. Drawing with black-board delineations, English Composition, Declamation, Reading, Spelling, Defining, Penmanship, Vocal Music, etc., receive attention throughout the year.

As this is designed to be a strictly professional institution, all studies, from the beginning to the end of the course, are taught with special reference to teaching them; and no study or exercise is deemed satisfactory which cannot be readily reproduced in the same or a better manner.

Students are required, in every study, to occupy temporarily the place of the teacher of the class, subject to the criticisms of both teacher and classmates; and, at appointed times, the more advanced students are required to take the charge of the whole department, and give a short general lesson, subject also to criticism.

All studies are treated upon the topical plan, with such use of text-books as may be deemed advisable.

DISCIPLINE.

All students are expected to govern themselves and to submit cheerfully to such rules as may be prescribed for the regulation of their studies, time, and general conduct during their connection with the College. If unable or unwilling to do this, they will be regarded as unfit for the responsible duties of the teachers' profession, and will not be retained.

CERTIFICATES AND DIPLOMA.

To such students as are able to remain at the institution only a portion of the time required for the full course, a certificate may be given, stating the time spent at the institution, and the general impressions of the teachers.

Those who complete satisfactorily the first two years of the course will be entitled to a certificate signed by the officers of the State Normal College and the State Board of Education.

Persons who can remain for only a part of the time prescribed, and have an honorable discharge, will be allowed to resume and complete the course at a future opportunity.

The Diploma of the University is given to those only who have completed the entire course, and on all such the degree of "LICENTIATE OF INSTRUCTION" is formally conferred. A law of the State of Tennessee directs that "the possession of such Diploma shall

exempt the holder thereof from the examination prescribed as a condition precedent to employment in the Public Schools of the State; any such graduate being eligible as a teacher in any county of the State."

Students holding scholarships, who enter the Senior Class, are required to remain at the College another year for still more advanced studies, and do not receive a Diploma until their course is completed, at which time the usual Baccalaureate degree of the University may be conferred.

TERMS, ETC.

The scholastic year commences on the first Wednesday in October, and closes on the last Wednesday in May. The year is divided into three terms, with but one regular vacation, *i. e.*, at the holidays. The daily sessions are short, and are designed to be actively employed in recitation, practice, etc., etc. All study and preparation for the student's work is to be done at his room.

LIBRARIES.

The College has access to the Library of the University—a select pedagogical library—and to those of the students' societies.

PHILOSOPHICAL AND CHEMICAL APPARATUS, ETC.

A large collection of well-selected apparatus has been recently purchased for the illustration of the various branches of Natural Science.

GEOLOGICAL AND MINERALOGICAL CABINET.

A very valuable and useful collection of Minerals has just been procured, sufficient to illustrate the physical properties of all the more important species. To this is added a large LITHOLOGICAL and PALEONTOLOGICAL COLLECTION, containing casts of all the more important fossils and extinct species of animals, prepared by Prof. H. A. Ward—such as the Megatherium, Pleisiosaurus, Glyptodon, etc.

EXPENSES.

Tuition is at present free. Every student, however, is expected to pay at the beginning of each term, \$2.00 for the use of such books as are provided by the institution, and for incidental expenses.

BOARD, ETC.

Board can be obtained in good families at prices varying from \$15 to \$20 per month—fuel and lights included.

Students are allowed to board only in families approved by the President, and are not permitted to change their boarding places without his consent.

PEABODY SCHOLARSHIPS.

In view of the want of well established and thoroughly furnished Normal Schools of a high order in the South, except for colored teachers, and of the fact that few of the States in this section of the country are in a condition to establish one at present within their own borders, the Trustees of the Peabody Education Fund have contributed a part of the amount necessary to convert the Literary Department of the University of Nashville into a State Normal College. They have furthermore determined to establish in this school a limited number of scholarships, of \$200 each, for the encouragement and aid of pupils from adjoining States, whose characters, abilities, general culture and health give special promise of usefulness as teachers.

Applicants must have the unqualified recommendation of the State Superintendent of Public Instruction, pass, with an examiner appointed by him for the purpose, a good examination for a graduate of a first-class High School, be accepted by President STEARNS, and promise to teach at least two years in the Public Schools, if they have opportunity. If, upon a half year's trial, reasonable expectations are not met, the scholarship will be discontinued. The longest period for which it will be given to any pupil is two years. Application is to be made to the undersigned, or to President STEARNS, through the State Superintendent.

PEABODY MEDALS.

Five Medals—two of silver and three of bronze—having been offered by the Trustees of the “Peabody Education Fund,” for distinguished excellence in the Advanced, Senior and Middle Classes, the following conditions of competition and award were prescribed by the undersigned, a committee of award, appointed by the Executive Committee of the Board.

The names of the successful competitors will be given in a future catalogue.

As a first condition for competition, all candidates must be members of the Advanced, Senior or Middle Classes, and must show that they have maintained an average of 90 per cent. as exhibited by the records of the instructors respectively, viz :

1. In constancy and punctuality of attendance upon daily sessions and all required exercises.
2. In general character, demeanor, and whatever appertains to general culture, as far as developed.
3. In scholarship.
4. In ability to manage classes and impart instruction, as shown in the regular work of the College.

All students exhibiting said rank will be entitled to HONORABLE MENTION in the Annual Catalogue of the University, over the signatures of the Committee of Award, and will be admitted to final competition for the Peabody Medals.

Members of the Junior Class exhibiting the rank required for competition in the other classes, and on the conditions prescribed for them, will be also entitled to Honorable Mention in the Annual University Catalogue.

At some session, during the month of May, all students in the Advanced Senior, and Middle Classes, thus entitled to compete for the medals, will be assigned some topic connected with their professional work, on which they will be required to write an exposition or essay in the presence of the Committee, or some person appointed by them. These essays will be examined by the Committee respectively, and ranked according to merit, and the rank thus obtained will be added to the rank before mentioned and decide the award.


