On October 2, 2006, the Asian Bankers Association (ABA) gave him recognition for contributing to the growth and development of the Association over the past 25 years and awarded Heh-Song with an Outstanding Service Medallion on the 25th Anniversary of the ABA in Taipei. Kennedy School of Government at Harvard University invited him to give a talk on "Taiwan and International Organizations: Achievements and Challenges" on November 28, 2006. The book covers such topics as: banking sector issues and reform in Taiwan, Japan, and the People's Republic of China; as well as the impact on the world economy of the overvalued US dollar, and the financial and economic integration of the European Union.

Over the years 2002-2007 Heh-Song has written and published several books. It is his hope that these books will attract the attention of the general public and encourage active discussion on global and domestic financial issues.
