The CSRC University Seminar for January will be "Religion and Comparative Allegory" a lecture by Anthony Yu Thursday, January 25, in G27 Divinity, at 4 p.m.

The Religion and Literature research group of the CSRC, with the support of several departments and the U Lectures Committee is sponsoring a visit to campus of Anthony Yu, Carl Darling Buck Distinguished Professor Emeritus of Humanities and Professor Emeritus of Religion and Literature (U. of Chicago, U. of Chicago Divinity School).

Yu will be lecturing on "Religion and Comparative Allegory" on Thursday, January 25, in G27 Divinity, at 4 p.m., with a reception to follow in Tillett Lounge. Please encourage your students and colleagues to come, and do come yourselves!

On Friday, January 25, at 7:30 a.m., Yu will also lead a seminar over breakfast in Buttrick 162. The subject will be trends in the field of religion and literature, and copies of a text on that topic from the Encyclopedia of Religion, written by Yu, will be available in the CSRC from January 10 on for you to pick up. Yu is noted as an expert on East-West literary relations and is viewed as an early figure in the field of religion and literature in this country (Morphologies of Faith). He is noted for his translation of the early Chinese novel, Journey to the West, and he continues to write (e.g. Rereading the Novel: Desire and the Making of Fiction in 'Dream of the Red Chamber' (2000), Women Writers of Traditional China: An Anthology of Poetry and Criticism (2000), State and Religion in China (2004). While at Chicago, where he also served as Dean of the Divinity School, Yu also taught in Comparative Literature and East Asian Studies, and for the Committee on Social Thought, in addition to Religion and Humanities. He continues to teach there part-time.
