Beginning Wednesday, September 21, at 6:30, John Holleman and Company will present four performances of the 1950's production of The Book of Job at Christ Church Cathedral. The play originated in Kentucky in the late fifties and was performed in a number of sanctuaries around the world for twenty years by the Everyman Players. John Holleman and Company is a theatre ensemble, a group of performers who study acting together while developing productions for performance. They specialize in masked theatre and museum theatre. In The Book of Job, sumptuous costumes and make-up design are used enabling the actors to create the illusion that vivid Byzantine mosaics have come to life. Additional performances are Friday, September 23 at 7:30 pm, Saturday, September 24 at 7:30 pm, and Sunday, September 25 at 4:00 pm. The cost of admission is \$10.00 for adults, \$8.00 for groups of 10 or more, and \$5.00 for students. The Cathedral is located at 900 Broadway in downtown Nashville.
