Professor Prince of Virginia Tech is the author and editor of about nine books, including works on violence, Kurosawa, Peckinpah, film theory, film genres, and politics.

He also has published essays in Film Quarterly, Cinema Journal, Quarterly Review of Film and Video, and The Chronicle of Higher Education.

The visit is under the auspices of a grant on Film and Religion from the Center for Religion and Culture with additional support from Film Studies, Philosophy, Communications, and English.
