The Cal Turner Program for Moral Leadership in the Professions is pleased to invite you to the following student discussion:

"Medicine, Ethics and Anthropology: Toward a Shared Research Nexus"

The presentation illustrates from an anthropological perspective the rationale for the development of a research nexus between medicine, ethics and anthropology. It examines research findings on the routine practice of episiotomy at a large university hospital in Rome, Italy, and the role of the institution and various clinical actors in the normalization of this procedure. It considers the question of informed consent around episiotomy, and how the perception that this procedure as not "ethically" significant allows clinicians and patients to dismiss it as natural, inevitable and unproblematic. This "naturalization" is possible because the routine episiotomy protocol acts as a system of informal audit that compels midwives to comply with physician, and specifically attending preference for routine episiotomy. The presentation will stress the shifting contexts and the flexible nature of agency and personhood in contemporary Euro-American settings, and their impact on interdisciplinary clinical practice such as in Midwifery and Obstetrics.
