Dr. Bonting, an emeritus professor of biochemistry and an Anglican priest-theologian, is a frequent lecturer in Europe and the Americas at conferences and for professional and general audiences on the convergence of religion and science. In the course of his work, Bonting has developed a revised creation theology, Chaos Theology, which has useful applications to theology (God's action in the world; Christ's reconciling work; health; eschatology) and for the reconciliation of science and theology.

Bonting was professor and chair of the Department of Biochemistry at the University if Nijmegen, The Netherlands. His main research topics were biochemistry of vision and active sodium transport. He was ordained a priest in the Episcopal Church, and has served as a scientific consultant for NASA at the Ames Research Center, Mountain View, CA, for preparation of biological research on the International Space Station.

Library News MAKING ROOM, no. 1

As regular users of the Divinity Library, most of you are aware of the space problems for both books and journals. We have moved tens of thousands of books and journals to the library annex already, based upon measured use patterns. For the first time, however, we now have removed the print copies of Religion Indexes, Catholic and Periodical Literature Index, Old Testament Abstracts, and Religious and Theological Abstracts for which we own electronic database copies.

We all would prefer to have both print and electronic versions of all materials available to us at all times, but we are in a difficult physical library environment, and choices must be made. We have moved these print copies of our electronic indexes to the collection development staff area, so that if something ever did happen to the electronic databases, we would still be able to retrieve these items.

This decision is just one of many that will of necessity be made over the upcoming months and years, as we attempt to keep the Divinity Library a functioning resource for all of you. Any ideas or comments will be most appreciated as we proceed. We will try to keep you informed via the Communicator about any new approaches to "making room."
