Songwriters Marshall Chapman, Danny Flowers and Tom Kimmel will trade songs inthe-round on the scenic observatory grounds overlooking Nashville starting at 7 p.m. Gates will open at 6 p.m.

Tickets are on sale now at Ticketmaster. Vanderbilt employees receive a discount by entering "vandytix" in the special offer code on Ticketmaster's Website. Tickets are available by the carload (limit eight people per car) or by single tickets. They may be purchased for each event or for the entire series. "When Vanderbilt employees purchase a season carload ticket, they may have seven of their closest friends join them for each of the five concerts for less than \$6 per person per show," said Rick Chappell, director of Dyer Observatory. "Where else can you see top-notch musical talent for that price?"
