

What if This Is as Good as It Gets? Sarratt Cinema

John Lachs, Centennial Professor of Philosophy

All our lives, we have believed that the future holds great promise, that things will be better tomorrow than they are today. This makes for great dissatisfaction with how things stand and a powerful drive to improve conditions. At some point in life, however, we reach the stage where things will not get better. 
